Open the hood and turn the engine on. Have someone smoothly crank the steering wheel left to right, while another person observes the power steering fluid reservoir. If there is air in the system, it will create bubbles. Then the fluid level will drop a little.

Because the pump is below the reservoir, the pressure line will get air-free fluid only. Turn the steering wheel slowly left and the rack will expel fluid back to the reservoir. Any trapped air will bubble to the top. Turn the steering wheel slowly right and the rack will draw air-free fluid from the reservoir.
